AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL: A WORLD-WIDE MOVEMENT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

Amnesty International is a worldwide movement of people who campaign for internationally recognized human rights to be respected and protected. Its supporters believe human rights abuses anywhere are the concern of people everywhere. Outraged by human rights abuses but inspired by hope for a better world, they work to improve people's lives through campaigning and international solidarity.

Amnesty International's mission is to conduct research and generate action to prevent and end grave abuses of human rights and to demand justice for those whose rights have been violated. Its over 3 million supporters, members and activists in some 150 countries and territories exert influence on governments, political bodies, companies and intergovernmental groups. Activists take up human rights issues by mobilizing public pressure through mass demonstrations, vigils and direct lobbying as well as online and offline campaigning. You can help make a real difference by becoming a member or supporter of Amnesty International.

BERLIN'S ENGLISH-SPEAKING GROUP

We set up the group in February 2002 as an English-language group. Our working language is English, but you certainly don't have to speak perfect English – or (any) German – to join us! Some of our members are native speakers of English; some are Germans who are interested in working in an international group; many come from other parts of the world entirely! We come from all walks of life and all age groups; some of us have lived in Berlin for many years, others are passing through. What unites us is our determination to make a difference in the cause of human rights – and to have fun doing so!

Like all Amnesty groups, and as one of more than 50 Amnesty groups in the Berlin-Brandenburg area, we play a vital role in the movement. Our focus is currently on human rights abuses in Cambodia and West Africa. We organise fundraising activities and stands, help to coordinate local events such as demonstrations or the annual Ten Mile Walk, and generally aim to increase public awareness of human rights issues.
